

VISA-FREE PRIVILEGES FOR CHINESE NATIONALS ENTERING THE PHILIPPINES

- Chinese nationals traveling to the Philippines strictly **for tourism or business** purposes may avail of the new visa-free entry privilege. The said privilege **allows for a non-extendable 14-day stay**, which is non-convertible to any other type of Philippine visa category.
- The visa-free privilege will be valid for entry only through the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) in Metro Manila and the Mactan-Cebu International Airport (MCIA) in Cebu. Upon arrival, Chinese nationals need to present a passport valid for at least six (6) months beyond the contemplated stay, confirmed hotel accommodation/booking, and a return or onward ticket to the next country of destination. To ensure that security and public order are maintained while facilitating the entry of legitimate travelers, checks on derogatory records of travelers will continue to apply.

Note: For a stay longer than thirty (30) days but not to exceed fifty nine (59) days, for tourism or business purposes, they may apply for a visa at Foreign Service Posts (FSP) in China, or any FSP in a country where the applicant has legal residence (example: ***Philippine Consulate General in Sydney for residents of NSW and New Caledonia***) through the <https://evisa.gov.ph/>.

All travellers must present an e-travel declaration to immigration counters upon arrival. You may apply up to 72 hours before arrival at <https://etravel.gov.ph>. Registration is free. Save the QR code for presentation at immigration counters.
